

Summary Exercise: Step 1

1. Choose a CS topic. This can be the subject of an important article, or a subject from a talk or research seminar that you may have attended. It may be related to your upcoming thesis proposal, or it may be any other subject of your interest. The scope can be broad or more specialized.
2. Also select and get the relevant literature for your topic – at least one key article, maybe more.

If you don't have an idea or special interest: we provide a list of recommended articles you can also choose from.

3. Send a mail with your topic. If it does **not** come from the list, the topic must be **approved** (otherwise you risk to work in vain on an unsuitable topic). Approval will be easier if you give a short motivation of your choice and attach the sources as PDF.

The final product at the end of the course has to be a summary of the chosen topic (maybe of a single article only).

It is allowed to revise your decision later at any time, e.g., if you realize that you like another topic better. But then you will have to redo all steps done so far
