
Review and Publication


- Submissions: 48 regular and 8 brief announcements

- 16 regular papers were selected for publication
 - acceptance rate of 33%.
- 10 submissions were accepted as brief announcements
- The proceedings also include 14 invited papers.

Number of Submissions and Acceptance Rate by Country







Number of Submissions by Country


