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
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Programme structure



Accreditation within Chalmers

Central committee reviewed all MSc programme proposals (2005)

- Common format of MSc programme curricula
 - 6 * 7.5 ECTS compulsory,
 - 6 * 7.5 ECTS elective,
 - 30 ECTS thesis
- CDIO inspired programme descriptions
 - CDIO = Conceive, Design, Implement, Operate
 - learning outcomes (for programme and all courses)
 - Introduce, Learn, Use/Apply (in different courses)
- All material in English
 - + Local and foreign students on common ground
 - Few native speakers is a limiting factor



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- Self-evaluation + group interviews
 - Forum for pedagogical discussions
 - Exchange ideas (again!)
