Hand-in and Exam Clarifications

Hand-in Clarifications

Here are some clarifications regarding the hand-in of your project. Firstly, the deadlines for **both the Group Report and the Individual Report** is in the second week of January, the same date and time as you had your weekly hand-ins throughout the course. As the 5th and 6th of January are no official study days, the deadlines for **all Tuesday groups** is on Wednesday, 07.00! This means, the deadlines are as follows:

Please observe that the deadlines **are strict**. Missing the deadline results in failing the course.

For the group part, the hand in consists of **one PDF containing all your reports** (week 1-4), and **one zip file containing the source code of your final system**. All things that are in the checklists of the assignments **have to** be present in the final report.

For the individual part, the hand in consists of **one PDF containing your individual report**.

Exam Clarifications

The oral exam dates for your group are now on the course homepage, in the Examination tab. During the oral exam, you will start as a group by presenting your system. That is, you are demonstrating the running tests. We will then ask you questions whenever we feel that this is necessary. You do not need to prepare any slides or a talk. If someone is between grades, we will send the other group members out and talk to that person only. Make sure that you know how your system works, even if you have not programmed all parts yourself.

Comments

Here are some additional comments or hints that might help you:

- For the banking component, use only credit card numbers that start with your group number. E.g. starting with “01” for Group 1, “05” for Group 5, or “11” for Group 11. This should avoid trouble in the oral examination/testing of your system, in case other groups have used the same credit card numbers.
- In assignment 5, it was written that “We do not want huge interfaces with 10+ methods.”. This is a guideline and was probably a bit optimistic. The real meaning is that you should split interfaces, especially if it has a lot of methods that are unrelated. You won’t fail if your interface has 11 methods.
